Confession & Absolution

Prayer Over the Ashes

Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. Grant that these ashes may be to us a sign of our mortality and penitence, that we may remember that it is only by your gracious gift that we are given everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Savior. **Amen.**

Instructions: Come forward to the table and leave your card in the basket. On the table you will also find a small container of ashes. You are invited to place the ashes on your forehead or the back of your hand in the sign of a cross. You may also choose to have a family member do it for you or someone else in your Pandemic Bubble. Once you have received the ashes please return to your seat. After everyone has received ashes we will recess to the steps of the church where we will burn our cards.

Recession to the fire

As we gather around the fire pit, we offer to God those things which are a barrier to drawing near to God and one another. We release them in the burning of these cards.

As you go, go forth in the knowledge of the connectedness of all things – that Christ has filled all things with his presence, and that even the dust on our foreheads, which will become the dust of our bodies, is sanctified by his own participation in them. Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. **Amen.**
