YOUTH FUTURES

MARY PAIGE TAYLOR, DIRECTOR OF YOUTH MINISTRY

It's been almost a whole year since we've gathered for worship together. It's been a tough year; at times it's been isolating, but we're finally seeing the light at the end of this tunnel. Whenever we do get to gather in-person again, it will definitely be a different experience than it was before, but we will be so much more thankful for those moments together.

This month, we will have our two weeks of the annual Youth Futures Campaign, and hopefully it'll remind us of some of that thankfulness. For these two weeks, we'll be spotlighting our youth program and having them lead worship in every way they can. The Youth Futures Campaign is our yearly fundraiser to continue to have opportunities for the youth to serve and travel through our Fusion and Belize Trips, along with offering retreats at various times during a normal year. This annual fundraiser is in place of doing numerous small fundraisers like spaghetti dinners or selling wrapping paper, so these funds we raise this month determine the possibility of retreats and mission trips in the future.

One Sunday, I'll be preaching on 1 Timothy 4:8-16 where Paul states that adults should allow the youth to be their example in how to love and serve. That concept has been made very apparent to me over the

last few years, but none so much as the last 15 months since I started this job. I've heard students say over and over "we want more mission opportunities during the summer. Let's split into smaller groups and go somewhere to work non-stop for 3 or 4 days. There's plenty of local opportunities around here, let's start our work here." These kids want to work in the midst of everything else they do. They are incredible. When everything got shut down last year, their hearts ached to be together, but their hearts also ached to serve in the ways they love. We've been able to find new ways to be the hands and feet of Jesus throughout the pandemic by doing canned food drives and making Compassion Bags for the homeless, but they've continually asked for more opportunities.

I hope that as you see these students lead in various ways, love each other, and minister to all they encounter, you'll be moved to donate to our campaign. In the midst of all of the uncertainty that is around us right now, let the youth be your beacon of hope because they are truly living out the call Jesus made to carry one another's burdens.





Mission and Outreach

March Focus: Fourth Ave UMC Open Door Ministry

Since 1991, Open Door Ministry at Fourth Avenue UMC has addressed issues of poverty and health. Their goal is to foster human thriving in Louisville! They offer warm, nutritious lunches and regularly scheduled dental and medical clinics. In 2019, they served nearly 50,000 lunches! While the pandemic has temporarily suspended their usual sit-down, hot meal, they continue to offer bag lunches for their guests five days per week. St. Paul is collecting the following items during March:

Individually packaged items for to-go bags, especially:

- Peanut butter crackers
- Potato chips, nacho chips, or multi-packs of individual packaged chips
- Fruit servings like applesauce cups or peach cups, etc. We try to put a "real" fruit serving in our to-go bags and the cups don't go bad like real fresh fruit
- Wrapped "bars," like granola or chewy snack bars

Paper goods and other supplies

- We can always use the 4 oz size souffle type cups with the snap-on lid. These are a bit more expensive to purchase in bulk so several folks may want to share a bigger ticket item like this. We use them to portion-out peanut butter to go into the sack lunches.
- Dawn dish washing liquid (Dawn works best)

Bulk supplies

- Cans of pork and beans (preferably the very large #10 cans, but we'll take any size)
- Regular sugar and brown sugar (bulk not individual packets)
- Cream soup for cooking (preferably cream of chicken or cream of celery). We cannot use any other kinds of soup right now
- Large jars of peanut butter, any style
- Large jars of salsa
- Sweet pickle relish for use in sandwich "salads" like tuna or chicken
- Barbeque sauce to go on cooked chicken or pork for BBQ sandwiches
- Hot dog buns

Faith Quilters - Blessing of the Quilts

Sunday, March 7 at 10:00am during online worship



Objects of comfort are highly prized in these trying days. A regrettable number of Kentucky's children are especially in need of comfort in the face of rising rates of poverty, substance abuse, and mental health problems leading to their abuse and neglect. Project Linus in Louisville distributes quilts sewn by St Paul UMC Faith Quilters to deliver a message of comfort, security, and love to youngsters the Child Advocacy Center, hospitals, and other local agencies that provide care to hurt children.



Faith Quilters has been steadily at this work since 2003. This year, since the annual Quilt Blessing March 8, 2020 (incidentally the date of St Paul's last in-person worship), has clearly been the most challenging of the group's history. Fellowship work days were not possible, but monthly contact and the work continued. Since that Blessing last spring,

83 colorful sturdy cotton quilts have been created for Project Linus distribution. They are tagged with the name of St Paul church and are intended to communicate God's love to a hurting child.

On Sunday, March 7, in virtual worship a prayer of blessing will be given for these quilts.

If you have a cherished quilt, or any object that brings you comfort, please bring it to that day's worship and add your own prayer for this mission of your church.


