YOUTH FUTURES

Janet and Billy Sewell, Co-Directors of Youth Ministry

It is hard to believe that it is May and the school year is almost over! This time of year always prompts reflection on how far we've come since the previous August. In a recent meeting we were talking about a service project that got canceled right before the school year started due to the Delta variant and we were all surprised at how long ago that seemed. Despite that initial setback we managed to kick off the school year in person, albeit with some safety modifications.

During this past school year we have had the privilege of watching these students grow closer with God and with each other. We were able to go on our first retreat since 2019. If you ask any of our students where they feel closest to God, they will almost all tell you Loucon. Being able to take them back there to grow in their faith was a top priority for this school year. We were also able to have our annual Progressive Dinner for the first time in two years. Five families hosted our students in their homes and at church to allow them to all fellowship together. While these are two of our larger events for the fall semester we have been able to safely host many other events for the students such as a lock-in and the upcoming senior banquet.

Another top priority for this school year was to ensure that these students got to experience the annual Fusion trip after a two year hiatus. We realized that over half of our group has never had the opportunity to attend! The Fusion trip is our annual trip that combines a mission trip and a choir tour. We typically lead worship at a church on Sunday then do mission work throughout the week that could consist of cooking, painting, singing, etc. In the past the students have gotten to work in areas such as Detroit, Chicago, Philadelphia, and even Belize! This year we will be working in Perry, GA (outside Atlanta) and Nashville, TN. One of the main ways you can support these amazing students in their endeavors is by giving to Youth Futures.

Youth Futures Sunday is May 15th and is the only fundraiser we do for the year. St. Paul Youth will not ask you to attend their chili cook-offs or car washes to raise money. Instead we do a single annual

fundraising campaign. On this Sunday, our students will lead both services and our seniors will take a few minutes to share how your generosity has helped shape their lives through their experiences at St. Paul. We hope you will join us in person or on the Facebook live stream on May 15th to see this group in action!

It has been an unspeakable pleasure watching these youth shine God's light for all to see over the last decade of volunteering with St. Paul Youth. Our admiration for these youth has only grown in our first full year of leading the program. We eagerly look forward to what the next year will bring.



St. Paul UMC Personnel Committee Update - 4/27/22

The Personnel Committee is pleased to share the following updates related to staffing:

- The Kentucky Conference of the United Methodist Church has reappointed both Senior Pastor Darren Brandon and Associate Pastor Dustin Woods to St. Paul for the coming year. They are eager to continue the work of discipleship as we all strive to Invite, Encourage and Connect – our theme for worship and ministry this year.
- St. Paul currently has three open staff positions that we expect to post by mid-May:
 - Family and Children's Director (full-time)
 - Administrative Assistant (part-time)
 - Finance Director (part-time)

Thank you to Pastors Darren and Dustin, along with staff, who have found creative solutions to manage the transition in Children's Ministry leadership following Tori's departure. Plans are in place to cover

weekly ministry, including several events that can be combined with the youth ministry. In the meantime, the Children's Ministry team, along with the Personnel Committee, will work together to discuss the overall ministry plan and post the position.

Following input from staff and church leadership, we are finalizing job descriptions for the Administrative Assistant and Finance Director positions, both of which will be part-time.

All three positions are critical to St. Paul's ministry and support of both the congregation and community. We look forward to having these posted soon with a thorough and efficient search process to fill each role. Updates on the search process will be provided through the Tower and weekly updates. Staff Spotlight:

Dr. Lori Elbert, Director of Koinonia Worship



If you had asked me 21 years ago if I thought I would still be on staff at St Paul today, I would have thought you were crazy; no one stays in a ministry position that long. But here I am, all these years later, still here; deeply rooted in our church and inspired to do ministry alongside this part of the body of Christ and the amazing staff and pastors we have here.

I originally came to St Paul as a member in 1997 because my best friend and roommate Karla Temple was here and invited me to come sing with the choir after I left my last ministry position. St Paul became my church family and loved and nurtured me. In 2001, my church family rejoiced with me as I married my husband in our then newly renovated sanctuary.

In June of that same year, I came on staff to be the director of our newly opened Family Life Center and play in the band at Koinonia. Over the years my job has morphed to align with the changes in my personal life and the needs of the church. In 2006, I stepped down to part time with responsibilities only in the 9:00 worship service as I finished my doctoral program and prepared to welcome our first children, Nina and Gideon, home. Since that time I have been planning and leading the Koinonia service.



My other responsibilities include supporting the worship and music ministries across our church. Sometimes that means filling in to lead rehearsals for Karla or Jim or helping to plan special events and

services. I lead the youth band and youth worship on Sunday nights. I also oversee the audio and video technology for the church. Most recently that has included getting our streaming ministry off the ground and running the stream each week for the traditional service. My two favorite weeks of the year



are Music Camp, which I get to help lead with Karla Temple, and Boar's Head, for which I have done a little bit of everything from being in the choir, to being a stand-in Woodsman, to running tech.

Over the years my family has grown as well. My husband Bruce and I have 4 children from 31 down to 9, and our granddaughter who is 12. We enjoy hiking, traveling (especially to Texas to see my family) and anything involving water. I love to read, write, and compose - although my busy schedule doesn't allow for much of those last two. But you will hear some of my songs and words around St Paul from time to time.

What a blessing it has been to me to be able to stay at one ministry position so long; to get to put down deep roots and make connections with our church family over the years. I could not have planned it, but in looking back, I wouldn't have it any other way.

Scout Troop 40 Anniversary Party! Saturday, May 21 from 1:00-5:00pm

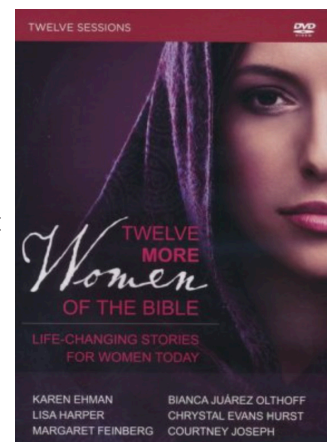

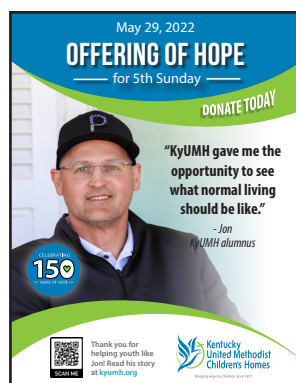

Vision Team Goal #6: The Resource Center

The Resource Center is St. Paul's primary outreach to the Louisville community.

By 2024, the goal for the Resource Center is to be operating and staffed by volunteers to serve 300 people monthly, as well as have a dedicated staff person.

Over the past two years, the Resource Center staff and volunteers have shown resilience by creating alternative ways to continue to serve those in need during the pandemic. Hence, the Mobile Resource Center idea was born. This partnership with Fourth Ave UMC's Open Door Community Ministry has been a success and is now an integral part of St. Paul's outreach efforts! Sara Ferebee, Bob Helvey, and a group of dedicated volunteers currently work to gather and organize supplies.



On the second Saturday of every month, volunteers pack up the supplies and head down to Fourth Ave UMC to serve those in need. Each month, they serve anywhere from 50-

90 people. This continues to be a great opportunity to reach 'beyond the walls' of St. Paul and have a positive impact on our community. Fourth Ave UMC has a small but mighty congregation that works hard to sustain their outreach to the downtown/ Old Louisville unhoused, transient, and low-income community. St. Paul wants to do all we can to grow this partnership and support this important work.

The Resource Center also continues to serve those who come to the church doors in need of assistance on Mondays and Wednesdays, as well as supporting other local organizations such as Highlands Community Ministries and Portland Food Pantry.
