

The Waiting Season

Recently, I was at church at night. The darkness made everything look so different. The image of Jesus in the stained glass window overlooks the comings and goings of Bardstown Rd. I take comfort in the thought that Jesus is present at the busy crossroads of our world. Another image of St. Paul I like is Cathy

Miller's watercolor painting. Looking at it I get a feeling of hope. As we enter the season of Advent and waiting, it helps to have a sign of hope.

The Advent promise is that Jesus is coming. We'll have to wait because what God is creating takes time. Some of the best things that come to us in life take time and should not be rushed: the birth of a child, a seed planted in the ground, or cooking a meal.

In the Christmas story, there is a lot of waiting. John the Baptist is waiting for the Messiah to come. While he waits, he preaches in the desert, sharing Good News. The message he offers to anyone who will listen is Prepare. Repent. Turn around. John the Baptist reminds us WHY we so desperately need God.

In moments of discouragement when life is not quite right, we can do something about our situation. We can repent and turn to God, whose reign is coming.

Others in the Christmas story are waiting too. Mary is waiting. She is waiting to understand the angel Gabriel's life-changing message. Like any moment when you get news that is hard to understand, she must have many emotions. Mary is perplexed, thoughtful, afraid, favored, and willing. Her final response is, "May it be with me as you say." Mary wholeheartedly says yes!

The message of Advent is that God is breaking into our world to restore and redeem all things. As we wait, I offer you this thought on trusting the "slow work of God."

Advent is a season of waiting and anticipation. As humans, we may find waiting a challenging experience. We have a tendency to reflect on the past or look to the future. But waiting requires us to be in the present moment - in the in-between of what was and what is to come. So as we journey through Advent, we invite you to join us as we share in Advent experiences that bring us into the present as we dwell in the Hope, Love, Joy, and Peace of the season.

Each session will begin with a brief devotion, followed by an Advent experience and the opportunity to share or reflect on the experience.

Hope: Create an Advent wreath

Love: Prayer Stations - A series of prayer stations will invite you into prayer as an act of love through words, images, writing, candles, and more. *Sanctuary.*



Joy: Campfire Sing-along - Gather for a time of warmth and fellowship as we share the joy of the season through Christmas carols around the fire. *Church lawn.* If weather prevents a campfire, we will move the sing-along indoors.

Peace: Labyrinth Walk - As we settle into this season of waiting, we will cultivate peace by walking the labyrinth together, accompanied by meditative music from renowned pianist Harry Pickens. Walking a labyrinth is an ancient prayer practice that allows body and soul to come together to center and ground us. *Gym.*

to wear a great costume! You may contact Karla Temple (karla@stpaulchurchky.org) to inquire about joining the cast.



Wellness Program for Seniors

"Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ" - Gal. 6:2

On October 4, 2022, SPAMS and Expressive Avenues:Wellness began the holistic wellness program Learning HOW to Age®. Twice a week, 7 adults aged 65 and over met for an hour to explore games and exercises to develop skills for mental flexibility, physical perception and kinesthetic awareness- 3 areas of wellness often neglected in wellness programs. The wellness class is limited to 10 participants to 1 facilitator, Angie Dortch has been facilitating this group.



Each week, participants' abilities are assessed. Personal testimonies from these participants can be viewed

at <https://www.learntoage.org>. A typical lesson includes a gathering time or warm up, introduction of a new game or training, practice of a previously introduced activity and a post meeting discussion. President of SPAMS, Glenda Young thinks an opportunity such as this is beneficial to everyone, but especially those active aging adults. As the data comes in, Expressive Avenues:Wellness anticipates participants will see a positive increase



in the skills needed for successful aging- mental focus and flexibility, sharpened awareness of and confidence in their own physical abilities, and autonomy and control. The social interaction and connection of a group



of people dedicated to this practice was the number one comment from the participants. The pandemic brought about the need for internet based communities, but this face to face meeting is universally lauded as indispensable.

After taking a break through the end of the year, this wellness group intends to resume, and SPAMS and Expressive Avenues:Wellness hope to sponsor an additional introduction class to Learning HOW to Age®. Contact Glenda Young at 742-1022 or 416-2657 for more information.
