Invitation to Lent

Dr. Lori Elbert, Director of Koinonia Worship

Pastor and Theologian Paul Tripp published an email where he stated that many Christians live in a state of practical atheism. We Christians say we believe in God, the resurrection of Jesus, and the power of the Holy Spirit, but we live like none of that matters. Robert Webber stated in his book Ancient Future Time: Sometimes we "live as though the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ never happened. Our lives become absorbed in the dayto-day experiences of life. We focus on name-brand clothing, the color of our automobile, the prestige in which others hold us, and the symbols of our own power: We too easily forget our maker and Redeemer, replacing God with things and ambition. Lent is the season that does something about this situation. It calls us back to God, back to basics. back to the spiritual realities of life. It calls us to put to death the sin and the indifference we have in our hearts toward God and our fellow persons. And it beckons us to enter once again into the joy of the Lord - the joy of a new life born out of a death to the old life."

During Lent, we journey with Christ through his life and ministry to the cross and empty tomb. We make time to reflect on what those events meant to history and also to us. We use the disciplines of Lent (prayer, fasting, and alms giving) as tools to help us deepen, repair, and transform our relationship with God. In short, Lent is an invitation to delve deeper into what life with and in Christ is all about: a Romans 6:4-6 life:

For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism. And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives. Since we have been united with him in his death, we will also be raised as he was. Our old sinful selves were crucified with Christ so that sin might lose its power in our lives. We are no longer slaves to sin. (NLT)

As we move into Lent, how will you walk the journey from Ashes to Joy this year? Lawrence Hull Stookey offers some thought-provoking questions for self examination:

- What progress am I making in sharing gladly what I have with others, particularly with the stranger and the poor?
- What attitudes do I convey to those who irritate me? How can my awareness of my own need of God's grace enable me to be more gracious to them?
- How has my sense of interconnectedness in corporate worship grown of late, and how can I move ahead in appreciating the contributions and needs of other members in the congregation to which I belong?
- Am I as charitable and thoughtful to family members as to others, or do I "take it out" on my family when life at school or work gets hectic?
- Can I redistribute my long-range personal budget in order to have more money to give away?
- When I hear someone being unjustly maligned, do I speak up to correct the record, or am I a silent accomplice?
- How can I more effectively and consistently support legislation and social programs that help the disadvantaged rather than hurt them?
- In devotional acts of prayer, what habits can I develop that allow me to be more responsive to the sick, the distressed, and the bereaved, particularly when their needs emerge suddenly and require immediate attention?
 Can I plan spaces into my life to allow for such unanticipated opportunities to minister to others?
- Am I, by consistent attendance at worship, a
 witness to others of the worthiness of the God
 I follow? Or am I, by my sporadic attendance,
 suggesting that God is worth serving some
 times, but not others?



Learning HOW to Age® Wellness Classes


In October 2022, SPAMS began offering a wellness class to its members. Participating in an introductory class is needed for enjoyment and success. The first introductory class has reached level one and is continuing.

On Tuesday, February 21st at 10am in McAdams Hall, SPAMS and Expressive Avenues: Wellness will sponsor another introduction using the holistic program Learning HOW to Age®. For 5-7 weeks, twice a week, adults aged 65 and over meet for an hour to learn games and exercises to develop skills for mental flexibility, physical perception, and kinesthetic awareness- 3 areas of wellness nealected in other wellness programs. The wellness class is limited to 10 participants to 1 facilitator. Angie Dortch facilitates this group. A typical lesson includes a warm up, introduction of a new game or training, practice of a previously introduced activity, and a post lesson discussion. President of SPAMS, Glenda Young, thinks an opportunity such as this is beneficial to everyone, but especially those active aging adults. Each participant gave a recorded testimonial about the benefits and challenges of the class. Their testimonials are on the website www.learntoage.org; just choose "testimonials" from the menu.


The data from the fall class has surpassed expectations with 11.84% increase in kinesthetic awareness:
