What do you hold on to that keeps you from getting lost?


What thread of hope keeps you grounded and connected to the unchangeable in our changing world?



Vision Goal 8: Small Group and Member Engagement by Gail Henson

Inviting. Getting connected. Belonging. Being a part of a group. Encouraging. Growing. Learning together. Working together. Building. Being the Body of Christ.

These verbs describe the aim of Vision Goal 8: Small group and member engagement. This goal seeks to connect and nurture everyone who is part of St. Paul through small groups and through being engaged in the work and life of the church, however that looks. A second part of this goal is to have a significant percentage of our average worship attendance participate in a recurring activity outside of worship (including small groups, Sunday School classes, Bible studies, etc.) at least on a quarterly basis. What's engagement mean for you? What kind of small group will nurture your faith and connection to each other?

While each of one of us is unique as an individual, we are all family as part of the Body of Christ. The Apostle Paul writes in I Corinthians 12:14: "The body does not consist of one member but of many ... As it is, God arranged the members of the body, each one of them, as he chose ... that the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together." That's a beautiful affirmation about the Body of Christ at St. Paul. Are you more of a hand, an eye, an ear, or a foot?

So simply being part of St. Paul gives you ways to connect and belong. We have over forty small groups that connect and engage folk, some in service, some in study, and others in worship through song or other arts. Check out the Small Group Directory and get plugged in! Need a nudge or a little help getting involved? Shoot the contact person listed an email or talk to one of the pastors!

In essence, we're all parts of one body that work together to make St Paul a joyful community. We all bring different talents to the table. As Paul writes in I Corinthians 12: 4-7: "There are varieties of Gifts, but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, it is the same God who activates all of the gifts in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." What gifts do you bring to St. Paul?

We affirm that each person has a ministry and role at St. Paul. That means you! There's a place for each of you to share your gifts of talent and time, in ways great and small. You can study the Bible with a small group or get involved beyond the walls. You can pray for people and being a listening ear. You can help cook meals for families in need, be an usher, call shut-ins, teach a class, work on a Habitat House or help with a refugee family. You can sing in the choir or help with the Resource Center. There's a place for you to share your gifts. Not sure where to plug in? In addition to the Small Groups Directory, the *Ready to Serve* form, available at the Information Center, may give you other avenues to engage. Check it out.

At St. Paul, we have been invited and encouraged to be part of the family of Christ. Families grow and change. Our family at St. Paul is always growing and changing, as the Apostle Paul prayed in Ephesians 5, "that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love."

May you find the group and ministry at St. Paul that nurtures you and allows you to engage with this Body of Christ.

Kentucky United Methodist Children's Home Offering of Hope

The next Offering of Hope is April 30, 2023!

In 2022 we served 1,433 children, youth and families! This is the highest number we have served in several years - all thanks to your generous support! We are expanding our services in two important ways:

- Due to the COVID pandemic, there has been a significant increase in the need for mental health support for children. In response, the Children's Home is adding staff and expanding its community counseling services across the state to reach more children and families in the Jessamine, Fayette, Daviess, Henderson, and Ohio county areas. Community-based programs serve over 1,000 clients in 2022.
- KyUMH has launched a new program to serve unaccompanied children from other countries that have endured traumatic experiences, and help them find stable homes and a path

towards citizenship. KyUMH was invited to join this program by another United



Methodist children's agency because of our excellence in caring for children in need. The very first child to be placed with his family through our new Caminos program told us, "Thank each and every one of you for taking good care of me. I will always remember you."
