Each month, we encounter new faces and unique needs, but we also see lots of familiar, friendly smiles.

Throughout the month, as Resource Center volunteers sort through the generous clothing donations we receive from all of you (thank you!), one of us will undoubtedly hold up a purple shirt or scarf and exclaim, "Denise would love this!" One is currently assisting people in their travel plans.

Vision Goal: SPAMS, St. Paul Adult Ministries for Seniors

In the last part of 2021, I longed to be back in the sanctuary of St. Paul. Prior to the church pausing inperson activities, I would sometimes think on Sunday morning, "Maybe I will not attend church today." I usually did but was not as thankful as I should have been. During this period, I had a legitimate reason for not going to church, but I very much wanted to return to the sanctuary and to St. Paul.

So I made a commitment to myself and God that whatever I could do or was asked to do in getting St. Paul back to normal activities, I would do.

Pastor Darren, staff members, and the vision team, led by Ed Henson, were working on getting things restarted at the church. Then that call came from Jon Fleshman, a member of the Vision team, asking me to assist in reactivating SPAMS. I knew that this was a door I had to walk through, regardless of what happened. I had many thoughts about accepting this assignment - such as, "Glenda, you are too old; speaking and writing are not your cup of tea." However, to keep my commitment to self and most importantly to God, I knew I must walk through this door. So I accepted.

My first action was to have several informative conversations with Betty Matthews, who had served on the SPAMS committee for several years. My next step was to call Michele Hundley. As you may remember, SPAMS was a very successful program under her leadership. She was very supportive and sent me a lot of information about previous events. Thank you, Michele, for your help.

Next, I contacted the previous SPAMS committee. The members were Betty Matthews, Ray Fore, and Deby Whittenberg - small in number but large in church experience at St. Paul. I spoke with Pastor Darren, and he suggested we hold our first event in April 2022. So I contacted Sara Ferebee, St. Paul Director of Communications and Outreach, and she took charge of publicity, and what a great job she did and is still doing.

There was another person who stood with me in planning the first event. It was Carmaleta Combs, who has since returned to Texas. We had many hours of conversations about what might and might



not work for this event. The church staff, led by the loving and creative Karla Temple, offered musical entertainment, as well as a skit, written by Lori Elbert, about a Wednesday night Zoom Bible study. It

was hilarious (watch it at the St. Paul <u>website</u>). Jim Murphy also entertained us with many humorous

jokes, and SPAMS participants Jon Fleshman and Kathleen Mynhier offered poetry recitations.





During the remainder of 2022, the SPAMS took a cruise on the Mary Miller Steamboat, enjoyed a potluck and musical entertainment by Paul Penny, toured the Thrive Center and Schimpff's Confectionery, and saw "White Christmas" at Derby Dinner

Playhouse. We also launched an ongoing wellness class for seniors, led by Angie Dortch.



In January 2023, the SPAMS diaper drive for MIHOW (Mothers and Infants Health Outreach Workers) collected 2,465 diapers, 3,360 baby wipes, and other generous donations for this valuable program at Henderson Settlement in southeastern Kentucky. Our March event was a potluck and entertainment by the St. Paul Strummers.

In April 2023, our event featured entertainment by the Wesleyan Choir (4th-6th graders), led by choir director Karla Temple and Jim McFarland on the piano. Thank you, Wesleyan Choir; you did a great job. And thank you for using the stage in McAdams Hall; I can remember when we used that stage a lot for programs held there. Also, I want to thank the parents of the singers for allowing their children to participate in this program. Finally, our thanks to Betty Jo, Janet, and Ray Fore for preparing and serving a delicious dinner for the event.

We have planned events for SPAMS through December of this year, which Sara will be telling you about in future church publications and communications channels.

I wish to thank Jon Fleshman for making that call and for the support he has given to me personally. I think Jon believes anything can be accomplished if you try. He is also a great bus driver. I will add that Jon was not well acquainted with me when he made that call. He is now!

New Adult Sunday Classes Forming

We are made for relationship, whether in family, friendships, or a church body. God blesses us when we live in community. As Paul wrote in his Letter to the Romans, chapter 12:4-5,

For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.

A loving Church community encourages and consoles one another sharing a deep and abiding love for God and one another.

The recent COVID-enforced isolation disrupted established communities and left me longing to return to my church community. During the pandemic, the St. Paul staff pivoted and adapted well to various forms of outreach using social media. However, it wasn't the same as meeting face to face with my study class. In classes, there are spontaneous side discussions, sharing deep concerns and joys, and sharing the word of God to better understand the life that He has set our feet to.

When we returned to church, the once noisy and crowded hallways were oddly dim, silent, and deserted. Now that we're back, we long to personally connect with church members. To that end, we are offering four new Adult Study Classes this August.

Of the six class descriptions outline below, we will begin by offering the four classes that receive the most registrants. Let us know your class preference by filling out the form at our website or at the Information Center at St. Paul. I strongly encourage you to consider joining a Sunday Adult Class. It will help you find a community within St. Paul and help you feel more connected to the church.

 Guys and God Sunday School Class - A men's studies class. Men address the many problems in the World and examine the effect of these problems on their souls. It is a deliberate look at what men believe about God, themselves, and the Church. • Connections Sunday
School Class - A women's
studies class. Women strive
to develop an authentic
connection to God and
others by studying various
authors to find out what
matters most, connecting to God.



- Being a United Methodist A class open to all to develop clarity about what it means to be a United Methodist. Materials to be studied include UMC Social Principles and books by a leading UMC author, Adam Hamilton. The intent is to help you better understand what United Methodists believe. Course materials will include UMC's Book of Discipline, Social Principles, and
- United Women in Faith, Circle of Friends The Mission of UWIF is to connect and nurture women through Christian spiritual formation, leadership development, creative fellowship and education so that they can inspire, influence and impact local and global communities.
- Animate Practices Journal Animate is an introduction to the central practices of the Christian faith, why they are important, and how we can take part in them today. Sessions feature stimulating perspectives on various topics by Christian thought leaders. The Journal includes prompts that allow participants to creatively practice each discipline.
- **UMC Family** A class for parents to discover God's intentions and plans for families. This is an opportunity for parents to share stories and support one another as they navigate family life.

It is my fervent hope that there will be more offerings each year. Should you have specific ideas for other Study Classes, I encourage you to reach out to Rev. Brandon, Rev. Woods, or myself and we will see about making it so.
