

# Vision Team Goal: Family, Children, and Youth Ministries

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. -Galatians 5:22-23 (NIV)

All of us know this verse-it describes everything we aspire to be as followers of Christ. It also describes all the attributes that are needed in our Family, Children, and Youth Ministries! One of these fruits of the Spirit has been particularly evident to me as I look back over the last year of these ministries: FAITHFULNESS.

In May, we welcomed Tracy Martin into the role of Family and Children's Ministries Director. During the summer under her faithful leadership, St. Paul welcomed 46 kids to VBS (including 20 new families!) and 10 Tweens to Project Serve. On August 13, the Back to School Bash was a huge success in getting all our kids, youth, and their families excited about all the opportunities to be involved in St. Paul this new school year.

In July, Karla Temple and Lori Elbert faithfully led 36 kids at Music Camp. This week of Music Camp brought a new family into our St Paul community, as well as 5 new girls indicating their intention to join Youth Group this fall (with 4 of those joining Youth Choir). Throughout the school year, the Children's and Youth Choirs meet every week, and we have the joy of seeing and hearing them perform during our worship services.

Janet and Billy Sewell have been faithfully leading our thriving youth group of 25-30 kids each week this year, while also welcoming their baby boy, Collin Allan Sewell, into the St. Paul family on July 6th! They led the FUSION choir trip and service project with 22 youth to Carbondale, IL, and St Louis in June, and sent 17 youth to Camp Loucon to grow in their faith.

In addition to these faithful leaders, the entire congregation of St Paul has been faithful in their support through prayer, financial contributions to youth futures, and providing the funds to pay half the fees for our children and youth to attend Camp Loucon!

None of these programs would have been possible without the army of faithful VOLUNTEERS who have given their time, talents, service, and hearts to this precious ministry to our children and youth. Sunday school teachers, Wesley night volunteers, 36 VBS volunteers, 7 adult volunteers who went with the youth on the FUSION trip, 16 youth volunteers at Music Camp, and so many more are necessary to make our Family, Children, and Youth Ministries happen.

At St. Paul, we are seeing the fruits of our faithfulness in the Family, Children, and Youth Ministries. As we celebrate surpassing our goal of 75 families being actively involved at St. Paul in 2023, we will continue to need faithful volunteers, especially Sunday School teachers for the fall who could cover just one week a month. Will you prayerfully consider being one of these faithful volunteers in this ministry? Your help will make it possible for this ministry to continue to grow and thrive!

# **SCOUTING NEWS FOR 2022-2023**

Troop 40 has been busy in the past year. We try to hold one outdoor adventure each month. Most recently, 7 scouts and 3 adults visited the National Scout Jamboree in West Virginia. There were activities and displays from across the country. At the historical displays, two of our scouts earned the Scouting Heritage merit badge.

We are very proud of the FOUR young men who completed their Eagle Scout rank this year. A major component of attaining the rank of Eagle is to plan and supervise a service project. Our scouts' four projects were to re-landscape the Dreams with Wings headquarters, to construct picnic tables for an outdoor classroom, to clean and organize a church storage area in the west end, and to construct large compost bins for Bellarmine University.

Service activities are an important part of Scouting, and we have fun doing them. A big activity every November is the Scouting for Food drive. In 2022 the scouts collected almost 3000 food items from the neighborhood, the bulk of which went to the St. Paul food pantry. We also help St. Paul with putting up and taking down the set for the Boar's Head Festival (though we could use more help!).

A different activity was our June 2023 camp-out at Lincoln State Park in Indiana. The scouts learned

about how Abraham Lincoln grew up, and the values gained through his life and experiences in the frontier. Assistant Scoutmaster Ed McInnis taught how our federal government was formed and reformed as our country grew, and Assistant Scoutmaster Norm Burton assisted scouts as they worked on their Dutch oven cooking skills. This was work toward the Citizenship In The Nation merit badge and the Cooking merit badge. Troop 40 is very fortunate to have highly knowledgeable leaders.

Cub Scout Pack 40 also had a great year. Some highlights were the two family camping trips. At the spring camp-out, cub scouts walked across a burning bridge to celebrate their move to Boy Scouts. The cubs went to Scout Night at the Louisville Bats and camped on the ball field. Our Pinewood Derby was a great success as well and was the first time in recent memory that it was held at St Paul.

Any youth curious about Scouting is welcome to visit us. Cub Scouting is a program for boys and girls in grades K-5, while Scouting is for ages 11-17. Our current Scout troop is entirely boys but we would be happy to start a girls Troop 40. if there is interest.

- 2. The meaning of the passage is made clear by considering such aspects as ancient customs, locations of places, and the meanings of words.
- 3. Students connect the meaning of the Scripture with their own lives.
