# **Advent**

As December dawns, we Christians celebrate the season of Advent. The English word *Advent* comes from the Latin word *adventus*, which means "coming." During this season, we celebrate the coming of Christ, God with us, at Christmas. We also look forward to His coming again one day to redeem our world and make all things new. We celebrate the fact that our God refuses to remain aloof and instead takes a vital and active role in the lives of those who look back to Christ's first coming and anticipate the second.

But Advent is also a season of waiting. We wait for Christ's ultimate return, just as we often find ourselves waiting for God to move in the here and now. But are we ready for God to show up? John the Baptist preached to the people in the wilderness, exhorting them to "Prepare the way of the Lord." What does he mean?

I recently had a fabulous time with our youth group on retreat at Camp Loucon. In the retreat lessons, we looked at several people from the Scriptures who experienced God showing up in a mighty way. Shepherd boy David was called to be a king and to repent of egregious sin when God worked in his life. Jonah was called to preach to people he despised, Esther to be an unwilling queen who

saved her people, Mary to mother the Son of God, and Jesus to die on a cross. One thing that all of

these people shared was that when God chose to move in their lives it shook things up and changed everything. Each of these also, sooner or later, opened themselves to God's presence and activity in their situations.

What happens in your life when God arrives? What happens in mine? What transformations might await us and what new things might God call us to? In the Advent season, we find ourselves waiting for answers to these questions. Advent calls us to prepare ourselves so that when the waiting is over, whether it's a particular situation or the renewal of all things, we are ready to receive what God has for us. How that looks for each of us will be different, but one thing will invariably be the same. Our opening of our eyes to God's possibilities, our accepting new things, and our letting go of old ones will take place with God in us and with us. Our God is big enough and God's commitment deep enough that, in ways both mysterious and wonderful, God works in us even now as we wait for Christ's return. Our God is the one who came, who abides, and who is coming again! Happy Advent! May we celebrate and anticipate the coming of the Lord!

Sunday, December 24 5:00pm & 10:30pm



Both services conclude with the singing of "Silent Night" by candlelight.

The Chancel Choir will be joined by the Bells of St. Paul Handbell Ensemble, Ernie Gross on clarinet, and percussion in some of the season's most beautiful carols and songs.

# December 2023 Hymn of the Month: O Come, All Ye Faithful

"O Come All Ye Faithful" is, far and away, one of the most well known and popular Christmas carols. It was originally written in Latin ("Adeste Fideles") and originated in the mid 18th century. This text is full of so many wonderful images of the story of the birth of Jesus and invites us to come and adore the Christ child as well.

Stanza 3 speaks of the choir of angels singing in the heavens. Although not often sung, stanza 4 shows us the shepherds leaving their flocks to come and find Jesus in his manger.

Stanza 2 is dense with theological meaning and deserves a moment's reflection. It includes words drawn straight from the Nicene Creed that speak of Jesus' divine and human nature:

"True God of true God, Light from Light Eternal, lo, he shuns not the Virgin's womb; Son of the Father, begotten, not created;" The second line here reminds us that Jesus was indeed born as a human baby despite the various heresies across the ages that have denied it. The first and third lines remind us that Jesus was indeed fully God in human form. Thus as we sing we remind ourselves that Jesus was 100% God and 100% Human.

Stanzas 5 and 6 speak of our response to the amazing revelation of Christ's birth. In stanza 5 we stand in awe around the manger and declare our love for Jesus. In Stanza 6, we sing our praise to the Word made flesh.

As we enter this holiday season and we hear and sing this carol, take a few moments to reflect on what it means that Christ came and took on our humanity so that we could be reconciled and returned to our Heavenly Father. O come let us adore him, Christ the Lord!

- O come, let us adore him, O come, let us adore him, O come, let us adore him, Christ the Lord.
- 2. True God of true God, Light from Light Eternal, lo, he shuns not the Virgin's womb; Son of the Father, begotten, not created; (*Refrain*)
- 3. Sing, choirs of angels, sing in exultation; O sing, all ye citizens of heaven above! Glory to God, all glory in the highest; (*Refrain*)
- 4. See how the shepherds, summoned to his cradle, leaving their flocks, draw nigh to gaze; we too will thither bend our joyful footsteps; (*Refrain*)
- 5. Child, for us sinners poor and in the manger, we would embrace thee with love and awe. Who would not love thee, loving us so dearly? (*Refrain*)
- 6. Yea, Lord, we greet thee, born this happy morning, Jesus, to thee be all glory given. Word of the Father, now in flesh appearing: (*Refrain*)


