JOINING IN WORSHIP FOR LENT

As I write this, it is a cold January morning and our Boar's Head Festival is still very fresh. But Spring and Lent are already on the horizon. Lent is a multifaceted season. Originally it was a time of preparation for those who would be joining the Church through baptisms that would occur on Easter Sunday at sunrise. We continue that tradition as our confirmation class will begin its journey on Ash Wednesday and complete it on Pentecost Sunday.

In solidarity with those who were on the journey to baptism, the Church as a whole began the practice of Lenten disciplines. The traditional Lenten disciplines are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. In modern times we think of either giving up something or taking on something that will bring us closer to Christ. There is nothing that I want more than to draw closer to Christ, to become more like Christ, to become the person I was created to be. One spiritual discipline that plays a key role in that personal development is rather simple (yet profound) and often overlooked in our current age: weekly worship attendance.

Worshiping together is a foundational spiritual discipline. All week, we are bombarded by the messages of the world around us. We are tempted to view our lives by the metric of Wall Street, Hollywood, or social media. Our worldview and life goals are pressed into the shape of things which God never intended. When we worship together, our vision is realigned with God's. Our values are pressed into the shape of the Kingdom of God rather than a political party. Our relationship with our church family, others committed to the Kingdom of God, is strengthened and renewed. We are supported in our joys and struggles as we support

our brothers and sisters in their joys and struggles. We hear the Word of God read and explained.

We sing the truths of our faith and have them sung to us. While weekly worship cannot be the only spiritual discipline we practice in order to grow our faith, neglecting it can leave us atrophied and isolated.

This Lent, we are asking our church family to prioritize weekly worship attendance in order to collectively grow our faith. This is more than simply sitting through one of our services--it includes actively preparing beforehand and joining in worship with all of our hearts, minds, and strength. To help us do that, we will be using the book ***Sunday Matters*** by Paul David Tripp. Dr. Tripp's book is 52 devotionals designed to prepare our hearts for what happens in worship each week. We, as a church, are invited to spend time either Saturday night or Sunday morning reading/praying through a devotional each week. We will use the book on Wednesday nights in Lent. We will feature the theme from each week as a Call to Worship each Sunday. We encourage you, as you are able, to purchase a copy of the book for you/your household's use. What is Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday occurs forty days before Easter, not including Sundays (which are considered feast days), and recalls the Israelites' forty years in the desert and Jesus' forty days in the wilderness. Lent is an opportunity to look deep into our hearts, and to recognize the extent of our estrangement from God. Through the disciplines of Lent such as prayer, fasting, and sacrificial giving, we are invited to see who we are without Christ, who we are through God's redeeming actions, what we are becoming by divine grace, and thus transforming the world around us as we grow.

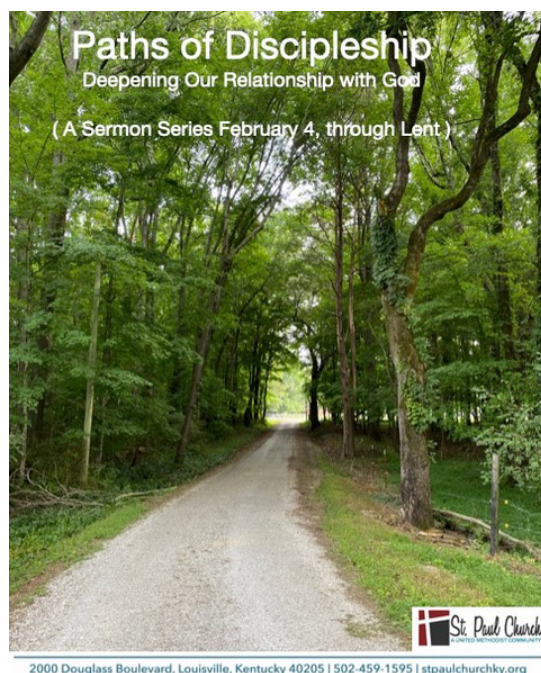

February 2024 Hymn of the Month: *Together We Serve*

Our hymn of the month for February is "Together We Serve." It can be found in our new *The Faith We Sing* hymn supplement. Daniel Charles Damon, a retired Methodist pastor living in the San Francisco Bay area, wrote both the text and the tune. "Together We Serve" was commissioned by First Presbyterian Church in San Anselmo, California in 1997 for their centennial celebrations.

The text and melody were composed together, resulting in a lilting waltz. The text describes what the church is to be – not the building, but the people who are the actual church. The first stanza sums up the theme of the hymn: We are united by God's love doing the work of the kingdom inviting people in. The second stanza speaks of our desire to share the light of Christ with the world around us even, as we live together as the Body of Christ over the years. The third reminds us of the welcome the church should be offering to *all* those around us. After the commissioning church reviewed an earlier draft, they requested Rev. Damon "put a little Jesus into it." The resulting final stanza sums up the power of our ministry in Jesus Christ which binds us together.

As we sing this hymn together this month, let it remind us of the bonds that unite us as the body of Christ and our mission to reach out to the rest of the world.

4. *Why? The Question on Replay - Finding freedom in not having all the answers.*
5. *A Better Broken - How to change despite our unchanging circumstances.*

After that, we'll begin Max Lucado's ***You Are Never Alone*** DVD Bible study, a walk through John's Gospel, which explores Christ's miracles and how He's still at work in our lives today!
