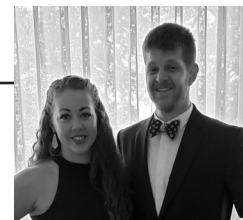

YOUTH FUTURES

Billy Sewell, Co-Director of Youth Ministry

In a recent sermon, Pastor Dustin discussed the topic of community. This topic has been on my mind for quite some time. Last May, Tyler Buchanan also delivered a sermon on community as part of our Youth Futures Sunday. He expressed how we are called into community and how we are called to care for one another just as the friends who lowered the paralytic through the roof did in Mark 2:1-12. As Dustin recently explained using the example of Jesus at the Temple, we are called to be a community within the church and outside the church. I have been excited to see the growth in our St. Paul community. Our church community is strengthening. I see this through potlucks, and church-wide parties, and especially during Wesley Nights when groups from all over the church gather together for a meal before splitting off into their Bible studies, small groups, and music practices. Our church community is also growing outside the walls through our Mobile Resource Center. I am truly heartened by the progress our church is making in building a community built on the example of Christ.

We have all heard the phrase, "It takes a village." As the parent of a soon-to-be 9 month old, I can certainly agree. But what makes a village truly special? Everyone's gifts working together. In Youth Group, we regularly discuss that we all have different gifts. It is easy to look at someone else's gifts and think that your gifts aren't as good as theirs. It is just as easy to look at someone else's gifts and think that your gifts are better than theirs. What is most important is that we value each other's gifts equally. When our gifts work together, we accomplish more than we ever could individually. In 1 Corinthians 12, Paul tells us of the fruits of the spirit and the church as the body of Christ in the world. Paul emphasizes the need for all different gifts and abilities through the example of different parts of the body working together as one. 1 Corinthians 12:18 says, "But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be." I am grateful for the gifts that surround me here at St Paul.



Janet and I can tell you with absolute certainty that this Youth Group could not run without our entire St. Paul village. We have incredible volunteers that are willing to travel for multiple days with 30 teenagers, lead small groups on Sunday nights, make meals for the entire group, transport kids at all hours of the day and night, and help support us in organizing everything. We also rely heavily on the generosity of the congregation. Our St. Paul village allows for our Youth Group to thrive. Our youth get to learn and grow together on their faith journeys here in the church and participate in numerous service opportunities in our community and around the region.

The last Sunday of this month, April 28th, will be Youth Futures Sunday. The Youth Group will be leading nearly all aspects of both services. The youth will be greeting, serving, singing, praying, witnessing, and preaching. Youth Futures Sunday acts as our program's primary source of fundraising for the year. Through the Youth Futures Fund, we fund almost every Youth Group activity throughout the year. This includes supplies for our Sunday Morning Service Projects and Sunday nights, fun events at church like our Lock-In and Senior Banquet, our annual Fall Retreat at Loucon, a large portion of our mission and choir trip each June, and half of the tuition for every St. Paul student who attends Loucon for Summer Camp. This list is far from exhaustive, but I hope you get the picture. We look forward to sharing these amazing youth with the entire church.

Thank you to our St Paul village! Until we meet again, I leave you with one of my favorite passages, Romans 12:9-13, "Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality."

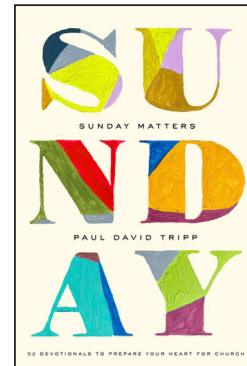

April 2024 Hymn of the Month: *He Lives*

Our April Hymn of the Month, *He Lives*, was a favorite in the small Nazarene church of my childhood and teenage years. The jaunty (and dare I say “boisterous”?) tune fits the joyful text which describes Christ rising from the dead! We sang these words out with conviction and gusto in my tiny church!

He Lives was written by Alfred Ackley in 1933. Ackley was an accomplished musician, even in his younger years. After completing his musical training in New York and then London, he attended seminary and became a pastor in California. He even spent some time working with famed evangelist Billy Sunday. While serving in California, Ackley began witnessing to a Jewish man who attended some of the evangelistic meetings. The man was not receptive—he kept asking why he should worship this “Jesus, a dead Jewish man.” This question haunted Ackley and continued to run through his mind. On Easter Sunday in 1933, he reread the Easter story from the gospel of Mark. Immediately afterward, he sat down to write, and the words to this hymn seemed to pour from his heart. That same day, he also wrote the music to this beloved hymn that answers the question of why we should worship Jesus Christ: “We serve a risen Savior!”

At the end of this hymn's refrain, we joyously proclaim, “You ask me how I know he lives? He lives within my heart!” As we learn and sing this hymn over the next month at St. Paul, I pray that this is our testimony. When we make the decision to follow Christ, we have the assurance of salvation and forgiveness, and we are granted a personal relationship with the living, resurrected Lord! Now, that’s something to sing about!

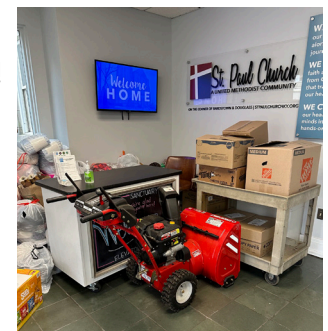


Waller-Williams Clothes

Bread for the World - Offering of Letters on April 14, 2024

Bread for the World is a Christian advocacy organization urging U.S. decision makers to do all they can to pursue a world without hunger. Bread's mission is to help concerned people to advocate for policies and programs that can help end hunger and provide better nutrition in the U.S. and around the world.

My Dad lost his father very early in life and his family was very poor throughout his childhood. My interest in the issue of poverty and hunger and in Bread for the World came mainly from hearing his stories and from the many verses in the Bible directing us to be God's hands and feet on earth.

One of the main activities of Bread for the World is to encourage local churches across the country to do an offering once a year. However, this isn't an offering of money, but rather is an offering of letters, written by church members to their U.S. Senators and U.S. Representatives to encourage support of certain legislation aimed at reducing hunger and food insecurity.

Members of St. Paul might remember that several years ago, our church participated in doing an Offering of Letters for three straight years and received a strong response from our congregation. On April 14th, we will be undertaking another Offering of Letters at our church.

The focus of this year's Offering of Letters will be on the Farm Bill, which is passed by the U.S. Congress every five years and greatly shapes how food assistance is done in our country. Areas of particular interest are: 1) GusNip, which increases funding for fresh produce within SNAP (food stamps) benefits; 2) reduce food waste, in part by better food labeling; 3) reauthorize the Food for Peace global nutrition program.
