NEW WESLEY NIGHT STUDY: LOVE DOES

Love isn't a feeling. It's an activity. It's something you do. And participating in the act of love is the secret to understanding God's love--the secret to a life well lived. The Love Does Bible Study is a based on Bob Goff's work and explores a love that's practical, functional, active. Not a "love" that has all the right answers. Not a "love" with ulterior motives. Not a "love" that's all talk or paralyzed by doubt. But a radically alive love that's an intentional participation in God's world. How is that kind of love done?

The how is what this study is about. Real growth happens when you learn how to tap into the empowering, energizing love of God. Using it fills you. Risking it secures you. Giving it satisfies you.

Each of the five sessions explores an aspect of God's active love through Bob Goff's teachings and stories. The study begins November 5 during Wesley Night and will feature different leaders for the sessions. Watch the church bulletin for details about ordering materials.
