A Practice for the Week: Leaving One Net

How is Jesus asking you to leave one net behind and follow him into something new. Here is a simple practice that helps us explore what it means to leave nets behind.

First, notice the net.

Ask yourself in prayer:

What is one net I'm holding onto that keeps me from following Jesus more freely right now?

Is there a net you're ready to release?

A burden you could help carry?

A small yes you could offer today?

Note: Nets aren't always bad things. **They're just familiar things.**

Second, leave it.

Don't aim to do everything. Just one intentional moment:

- Put the phone down during a conversation
- Say yes to helping when it's inconvenient
- Letting go of the need to control outcomes
- Pause to listen instead of rushing to fix
-

Note: Leaving nets doesn't mean changing everything. **It means changing one moment.**

Third, follow where Jesus leads.

At the end of the day or week, reflect:

- Where did I sense Jesus leading me?
- Who benefited from that small act?
- How did it feel to live differently, even briefly?

Note: Respond in your heart to how Jesus is speaking to you this day.
